#### **ABOUT THE ARTISTS**



Baritone **SeokJong Baek** is a second-year master's degree candidate at Manhattan School of Music under the tutelage of Ashley Putnam. Previous credits include Germont in *La traviata* with

Aspen Music Festival; Marcello (cover) in La bohème with the Martina Arroyo Foundation's Prelude to Performance program; and Tschang in Das Land des Lächelns and Gautru in Le Roi l'a dit with MSM. This summer. Baek will be a young artist at San Francisco Opera's Merola Opera Program, where he will sing Zurga in Les Pêcheurs de perles and Masetto in Don Giovanni. Next season, he will be a resident artist at Lyric Opera of Kansas City. Baek won first place at the 2018 Alan M and Joan Taub Ades Vocal Competition, as well as a special prize at the Sonora International Competition Francisco Araiza in Mexico, second place at New Jersey State Opera's Alfredo Silipigni Vocal Competition, and second place at New Jersey Association of Verismo Opera's International Vocal Competition. He is a recipient of the Presser Foundation Scholarship and the Mae Zenke Orvis Scholarship in Opera Studies.



Soprano **Shaina Martinez** is a second-year master's student at Manhattan School of Music, studying with Ruth Golden. This past year, she performed Fiordiligi in MSM's Opera Repertory Theatre

production of Così fan tutte, as well as Saffi in the MSM Opera Theater production of *Der Zigeunerbaron*. She also performed Donna Elvira in Lighthouse Opera Company's Don Giovanni. She performed her first lead role, Salud, in Manuel de Falla's La Vida Breve with The In Series, for which she was hailed by The Washington Post as a "piercing, muscular soprano." Other credits include Marie in La Fille du régiment and Cousin in Madama Butterfly with the Martina Arroyo Foundation's Prelude to Performance program in 2015. This year, she won third place in the Alan M. and Joan Taub Ades Vocal Competition, placed second in the Rocky Mountain Regionals of the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions, and won first place in the voice category of MSM's Concerto Competition. She also placed second in the Sue Goetz Ross Memorial Student Competition for Voice and was a semifinalist in the XVII Concurso Internacional de Canto Lírico in Peru.

#### **ABOUT THE ARTISTS**



Pianist **Craig Rutenberg** is a native of New Haven, Connecticut. After advanced studies in linguistics, German and Italian at Georgetown University, Rutenberg spent two years at the University of

Illinois in Champaign-Urbana, where he studied accompanying with John Wustman and opera preparation with David Lloyd. He pursued further studies in Paris and London with Pierre Bernac, Martin Isepp, Geoffrey Parsons and Miriam Solovieff. Rutenberg was head of music at the Metropolitan Opera from 1990-1992 and again from 2006-2015. He has also worked at opera houses such as San Francisco Opera, Houston Grand Opera, Lyric Opera of Chicago, Opéra de Paris and Opéra Comique, as well as the festivals in Aix-en-Provence and Glyndebourne. He has appeared in recital with Christine Brewer, Susanne Mentzer, Frederica von Stade, Ben Heppner, Jerry Hadley, Thomas Hampson, Eric Owens and René Pape, as well as many other singers. He records for EMI, DG and RCA. Currently a guest coach at the Mariinsky Opera in Saint Petersburg, as well as a faculty member of Manhattan School of Music, Rutenberg also gives classes this season at Palm Beach Opera, Zurich Opera Studio and Gothenburg Opera.
