NATIONAL TRUSTEE FORUM

Wednesday, March 5, 1:00 p.m. – 3:30 p.m. Thursday–Friday, March 6 and 7, 9:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.

The 2025 National Trustee Forum will offer board members insight into trends and issues, successful strategies, and governance concepts to reinforce their service to their companies and communities. Sessions will include:

- **State of the Field**: A review of current industry trends and a comparative analysis of participating opera companies' fiscal health and productivity, drawing on the soon-to-be published Annual Field Report.
- **State of Boards**: How do senior staff at opera companies regard the effectiveness of their board members? This presentation will draw on the anonymous feedback of a recent survey to examine the staff's perceptions of how board members can be better advocates for their companies.
- **Rebuilding the Team**: Zoom allowed for unprecedented participation around a virtual board table during the pandemic, but in time, it has weakened the communal bonds that strengthen effective governance. How are boards rebuilding their cohesion and team spirit?
- Activating New Audiences: An exploration of the findings of OPERA America's recently published *Understanding Opera's New Audiences* national study with a discussion about how opera companies are starting to translate research into strategic action.
- **Making a Career as an Artist**: Hear from a leading mainstage soloist about the dynamics of forging a sustainable career in the opera industry today.
- **Changes for the Better**: The pandemic was a disruption of historic dimension, and sometimes disruption is a necessary precursor to healthy change. What changes have companies embraced that represent a step forward from pre-pandemic practices?
- **Preparing for Advocacy**: A primer on how boards can strengthen their federal, state, and local advocacy muscles so they are prepared to act in times of need.

Participants hear from experts, learn from one another, and forge lasting friendships with opera-devoted peers at other companies across the country.
